## PARK HAPPENINGS

Charlton Park was the proud nominee of the Barry County Chamber of Commerce's Distinctive Destination Award during its annual dinner on January 21 at the Barry Community Enrichment Center. This is the 4<sup>th</sup> Chamber award nomination for the Park and Dan Patton accepted the recognition on behalf of the Park Board, volunteers and staff. Also that evening, the Charlton Park Gas and Steam Club kicked off their season of event planning with the annual potluck supper for 33 attendees in the Park's Carlton Center Church basement.

Charlton Park hosted 150 Boy Scouts from the Gerald R. Ford Council during the annual Winter Klondike on February 3-5. Attendees enjoyed learning about outdoor survival skills, watching ice rescue demonstrations, sledding, and preparing meals onsite.

The Park also hosted 60 people for the Sportsman's Outreach Team Kids Free Fishing Weekend at the beach on February 18. 27 kids under the age of 15 were the recipients of free ice fishing gear and the Michigan DNR waived the fishing license requirement for all anglers that day. Thank you to Dave Neeson and his crew for organizing the event and to Al &

Pete's Sport Shop and K&E Tackle for sponsoring the day.

On February 19 the Park welcomed local naturalist Harry Wallin (photo), who presented on how to identify local trees when there are no leaves present. ## COLLECTIONS & EXHIBITS

The collections and exhibits department is busy preparing an exhibit on World War I to open in April 2017. The exhibit will focus on America's involvement in WWI, which will include information about Barry County's soldiers with artifacts held in Historic Charlton Park's collection. The exhibit, *Tangled Alliances: The United States in WWI* and will host a series of speakers, which will be announced once the slate is confirmed.

Although artifact acquisitions are relatively limited, the collections committee recently accepted a

small decorative plate with Hastings High School painted on it (photo). Stamped on the back are the words, "Painted and Imported for Meyer's 5 & 10 Store Hastings, Mich." The High School was built 1917-1918 and Meyer's was in
