MILLAGE INFORMATION

Historic Charlton Park became a Barry County Park in 1936 and has been millage funded since 1986. The yearly estimated cost for the owner of a home worth \$100,000 would be \$18.75 per year, equal to \$1.56 per month.

The funds collected from the millage are used to provide educational programs, provide historical exhibits, preserve and protect historic artifacts and buildings, improve and maintain natural and recreational areas, hiring of staff, and provide opportunities like fishing, picnicking, walking, biking, and hiking.



MILLAGE PROPOSITION NEW ADDITIONAL MILLAGE FOR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF HISTORIC CHARLTON PARK VILLAGE, MUSEUM AND RECREATION AREA

Shall the limitation on general ad valorem taxes that may be assessed against all taxable real and personal property in Barry County, Michigan be increased as provided by Section 6, Article IX of the Michigan Constitution of 1963, by 0.3750 mill (\$0.3750 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of ten (10) years, 2017 through 2026, both inclusive, to provide funding for operation and maintenance of Historic Charlton Park Village, Museum and Recreation Area, subject to reduction as provided by law?

The purpose of this levy is to provide funding for operation and maintenance of Historic Charlton Park Village, Museum and Recreation Area, and related recreation facilities and programs including, but not limited to, educational programs, preservation of historic artifacts, conserving of historic structures, and maintaining recreational resources, trails, and park safety.

If approved, it is estimated that the levy of 0.3750 mill will provide revenue of \$767,476 in the first calendar year of the levy of which \$755,298 will be disbursed to Barry County for the operation and maintenance of Historic Charlton Park Village, Museum and Recreation Area. It is estimated that \$12,178 will be disbursed among the City of Hastings DDA and LDFA, and Village of Middleville DDA. The estimated \$12,178 is levied within a predefined area in the City of Hastings and Village of Middleville only.

Uncle Irving's Attic is now open to the public! Irving Charlton's vision for the preservation of rural Michigan began with his donation of 210 acres of land to Barry County in 1936. His collection of artifacts records the history of Barry County's citizens and furnishes the historic buildings. The exhibit recalls the early days of the Park, when the stone museum building was full of Irving's collections.
